

- Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19) Outbreak," Federal Register Vol. 85, No. 53 at 15337-38, are not eligible for emergency financial aid grants.
- Secretary's letter to college and university presidents The CARES Act provides institutions
 with significant discretion on how to award this emergency assistance to students. This means
 that each institution may develop its own system and process for determining how to allocate
 these funds, which may include distributing the funds to all students or only to students who
 demonstrate significant need.
- Secretary's letter to college and university presidents The only statutory requirement is that
 the funds be used to cover expenses related to the disruption of campus operations due to
 coronavirus (including eligible expenses under a student's cost of attendance, such as food,
 housing, course materials, technology, health care, and child care).
- Secretary's letter to college and university presidents encourage the leadership of each institution to prioritize your students with the greatest need, but at the same time consider establishing a maximum funding threshold for each student to ensure that these funds are
